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Section 1 Introduction

American SportWorks welcomes you to its growing family of new product owners. This Utility Vehicle "UTV" is a light utility vehicle that has been designed with care and built by skilled workers using quality materials. Proper set-up, maintenance and safe operating practices will help you get years of satisfactory use from this vehicle.

Safety First

American SportWorks is fully aware of the need for safe operating procedures around all of our equipment. We hope you will make a sincere effort to put safety above all other priorities. The Utility Vehicle was designed and built for work, recreation, and enjoyment; however, improper and irresponsible operation could result in serious injury or death. Since this is an off-road vehicle, operators will seldom see the road safety and warning signs they are accustomed to seeing on highways and public streets. This places additional responsibility on the driver to operate this vehicle well within the safe operational limits and capabilities of the unit.

This manual has been prepared to instruct you in the safe and responsible operation of your Utility Vehicle. Read and abide by all safety alert information about this vehicle. If you do not understand any part of this manual, contact your local dealer for additional information and clarification. As the operator of this piece of equipment, you are in complete control. Only you can prevent an accident from happening.

Using This Manual

- * Prior to any vehicle operation it is absolutely essential that you read and comprehend each section in this manual to develop an understanding of your vehicle and for your safety. After reviewing this manual, store it in a dry and easily accessible place for future reference.
- * The Operator's Section is designed to help familiarize you with safety, assembly, operation, adjustments, troubleshooting, and maintenance. Read this manual and follow the recommendations to help ensure safe and efficient operation.
- * The information contained within this manual was current at the time of printing. Some parts may change slightly to assure you of the best performance.
- * To order a new Operator's or Parts Manual contact your authorized dealer.

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Terminology

Right-hand and left-hand as used in this manual are determined by facing the direction the vehicle will travel while in use unless otherwise stated.

Getting Acquainted with your Utility Vehicle

This off-road utility vehicle is a very unique vehicle designed exclusively for off-road use. It is not designed, properly equipped, or licensed to be safely operated on public streets and highways. This vehicle is designed to carry two people and a limited amount of gear or cargo comfortably and safely over rough terrain that was only accessible by ATV's in the past.

Unlike ATV's that have handlebar steering, Utility Vehicle's have a steering wheel with easy handling rack-and pinion steering. The steering's tight turning radius makes this vehicle more maneuverable than most ATV's. Its four wheeled independent suspension, large diameter hi-flotation tires and high center-frame ground clearance adds up to excellent stability and a smooth ride over rough terrain. Outstanding two wheeled rear traction drive is achieved by using premium off-road ATV type tires in tandem with the engine mounted directly in front of the rear differential.

Also unlike an ATV's one person "straddle saddle" seat, the Utility Vehicle sports dual headrest cushioned seats with seat belts mounted in a highly styled and protective full length body. Two passengers can ride comfortably in this vehicle protected from splashing water and mud. The Brush Guard Bar mounted to the vehicle's frame provides protection against low hanging limbs and briars.

Section 1 Introduction

The Brush Guard Bar also provides a mounting system for American SportWorks optional windshields, canopy tops and weather enclosures. It also serves as a mounting base for many other optional cargo racks, gun and bow racks.

The cargo bed is for transporting accessories such as camping equipment, tree stands, hunting gear, and fishing gear. A standard hitch mounting plate enables quick installation of a rear hitch for pulling small trailers full of supplies, tools, gear, and game.

The Utility Vehicle has some similarities to an ATV. Like an ATV the Utility Vehicle has a short wheelbase, narrow stance, and high center clearance all which provide for narrow and difficult trail access. This combination of short wheelbase and narrow stance also enables this vehicle to be loaded in the back of most full to mid-sized pickups for transport.

The Utility Vehicle's ground compaction and is very gentle on the ground and surrounding vegetation. The highly energized four wheeled independent suspension system provides an incredibly soft ride and outstanding stability over difficult terrain. The engine is EPA certified and meets California Air Resources Board (CARB) certification standards.

Owner Assistance

The safety information should be viewed by the owner and the Warranty Registration card should be filled out by the dealer at the time of purchase. The owner, upon purchasing the vehicle, should have participated in a short drivers training course with the dealer. This information is necessary to provide you with quality customer service.

The parts on your Utility Vehicle have been specially designed and should only be replaced with genuine American SportWorks parts.

If customer service or repair parts are required contact a American SportWorks dealer. They have trained personnel, genuine repair parts and equipment specially designed to repair American SportWorks products.





Section 2 Safety

Safe Operating Procedures

The safe operation of any machinery is a big concern to all consumers. Your Utility Vehicle has been designed with many built-in safety features. However, no one should operate this vehicle before carefully reading this Operator's Manual. Also read all instructions noted on the safety decals.

- * Be familiar with all functions of this vehicle.
- * Keep all bystanders away from this vehicle during operation.
- * Do not allow anyone to operate this vehicle who has not fully read and comprehended this manual and who has not been properly trained in the safe operation of this vehicle.
- * Do not operate a vehicle with damaged or defective parts. Repair all damages and defective parts before putting vehicle back in to service.
- * Do not allow anyone under 16 years of age to operate this vehicle.
- * Operator must always use both hands on the steering wheel.
- * No riders allowed except in factory designed and supplied seating.
- * Operate this vehicle from the driver's seat only.
- * Do not leave this vehicle unattended with engine running.
- * Do not dismount a moving vehicle as serious injury or death could occur.
- * Always operate vehicle with belt guard installed. Do not leave pulleys and belts exposed.
- * Do not touch engine, engine exhaust pipe and/or muffler while they are hot.
- * Keep hands, feet, long hair, clothing, and jewelry away from moving parts and obvious pinch points to avoid getting caught.
- * Wear snug-fitting clothing to avoid entanglement with moving parts.

- * Some conditions may warrant extra safety gear to be worn such as safety helmets and/or goggles.
- * Keep hands, arms, feet and all bodily appendages safely inside the confines of the vehicle.
- * Always be aware of and avoid tree limbs and brush that have a potential of hitting and/or poking individuals riding the vehicle. Serious body harm could result.
- * Avoid sudden stops, starts, and turns.
- * Always operate your vehicle at a safe speed that will allow you to maintain control.
- * Operator and passenger are responsible for deciding if their situation warrants using seat belts.
- * Do not exceed total payload capacity of this vehicle.
- * Do not pull a trailer or implement exceeding 1100 pound towing capacity or loss of control may result.
- * Do not attach an implement, trailer or other device to the hitch that will produce negative tongue weight.
- * Follow all towing instructions in this manual when towing the UTV behind another vehicle. Do not tow vehicle faster than 25 MPH.
- * Do not use the vehicle as an anchor device.
- * Beware, tow ropes, cables and chains can break when pulling another vehicle or object causing serious injury or death to anyone in line with the whipping action created when they break. Never jerk when pulling, always ease into a pull gently. Always stay clear of the tow line. Never be in line with the tow line.
- * Reduce speed when loaded with cargo. Heavy cargo load takes longer to stop.
- * Reduce speed and payload on hilly, rough, wet, slick or unstable ground.
- * Always make turns at a speed that will maintain control of vehicle. Never make turns at full speed. Reduce speed when turning empty and reduce speed even more when turning loaded with cargo or when pulling a cargo load. The heaver the cargo load, the slower the turn should be.
- * Make sure all gear or cargo is properly secured and tied down.

- * Do not exceed 400 lbs. in cargo bed area (NOTE: 300lbs with rear seat kit installed), or 900 lbs. total on this vehicle.
- * Do not mount a receiver hitch type carrier platform to the vehicle.
- * Do not load the Brush Guard Bar with heavy equipment. Rollover could result from such loading.
- * The Brush Guard Bar is not certified ROPS (Roll Over Protection System). Always avoid rollovers.
- * Do not operate this vehicle on highways, public roads, or where it may be a hazard to faster moving traffic.
- * Do not operate this vehicle while drinking or under the influence of alcohol and drugs.
- * Never attempt wheelies, jumps, or other stunts. Never drive recklessly. Always operate your vehicle at a safe speed that will allow you to maintain control.
- * Never use vehicle for racing and never modify the engine to exceed 25 MPH vehicle speed.
- * Never modify any parts on the vehicle without authorization. Unauthorized modifications will void warranty to all parts directly and indirectly affected by the modification.
- * Always make sure the vehicle pathway is clear of all objects when backing up. Know location of personnel around vehicle and especially location of small children. Take extra precautions when rear view is hindered by cargo.
- * Always park on level ground, stop engine, set parking brake and remove ignition key before leaving the vehicle. Chock tires if condition warrants.
- * Use extreme caution when cresting hills or when visibility is limited. Proceed slowly until you are sure trail conditions immediately ahead are safe.
- * Keep front wheels straight when cresting hills or going over bumps.
- * Do not stop, start suddenly or over accelerate on hills. Loss of control and rollover could result.
- * Use extreme caution when descending hills or running on loose slippery surfaces. Towing, braking, and tractive capabilities are greatly diminished.
- * Do not operate vehicle on 15 degree slopes or steeper.

- * Avoid changing direction or making sharp steering corrections on slopes or rollover may occur.
- * If this vehicle begins to tip when crossing a slope, turn the front wheels downhill to regain stability and control.
- * When crossing a slope on soft terrain, turn the front wheels slightly uphill and maintain a constant speed to maintain a straight line of travel.
- * When descending hills or slopes apply steady pressure to the foot brake to avoid potential of freewheeling or runaway.
- * Never allow vehicle to coast or free wheel in neutral or loss of control may result.
- * If your vehicle loses power and stops on a hill, immediately engage the foot brake and back slowly down the hill maintaining a straight downhill line of travel. Do not attempt to turn the vehicle sideways on the hill or a rollover could result.
- * When traveling at night always use your headlights and reduce speed according to visibility, trail, and terrain conditions.
- * Avoid water crossings when possible and never cross a body of water where depth is unknown. Loss of power will occur if the drive belt becomes submerged or wet. Unnecessary crossing of streams and waterways erodes shore line and damages water-born habitat. If you must cross, do it at a point where banks are not steep and proceed at a slow and steady speed.
- * Front bumper and brush guards are not designed as pusher bars. Do not attempt to push other vehicles or implements or damage may result.
- * When refueling use an (UL) approved non-metallic container that has no screen or filter. Set the container on the ground before fueling to eliminate static discharge and do not use Methanol fuel.
- * Do not smoke or use electrical devices including cell phones while refueling.
- * Always maintain proper tire inflation.
- * Always disconnect the negative battery terminal before making adjustments to the vehicle electrical system or welding on this vehicle.
- * Battery fumes are explosive. A spark will ignite battery fumes. Wear a face shield when charging or jumping a

battery. Follow all battery safety rules outlined in this manual.

- * Avoid battery acid spills. Do not get battery acid on eyes, face, or other body parts. Flush eyes and other body parts immediately with water for at least 15 minutes if battery acid has gotten on them.
- * Always check wheel lug nut torque values two hours after initial operation and two hours after each tire repair and/or replacement. Routinely check lug nut torque valves every 100 hours of operation.
- * Support this vehicle securely before working beneath. Chock the wheels to prevent the vehicle from rolling.
- * Do not shift transaxle unless this vehicle is fully stopped and the engine is at idle or damage may occur.

Each vehicle must undergo a Pre-Delivery Inspection by the Dealer. Listed below is an example of the checklist that is included with the Warranty Registration that is to be submitted to American SportWorks upon Retail Sale. The Pre-Delivery Certificate and Warranty Registration must be submitted to American SportWorks in order to activate the vehicle warranty.

Pre-Delivery Steps

The dealer is required to complete "Pre-Delivery" steps before customer may take possession of the vehicle. This information must be filled in and check list checked off or initialed by individuals performing the checks. Dealership's name, signatures of individuals filling in the form, seller's signature, customer's signature, and signing dates are also required.

Below is a list of the information that is required to be completed and checked off.

Check tire pressure to make sure front and rear tires have 5 psi.
Make sure wheel lug bolts/nuts are tightened to 90 Newton meters (65ft.lbs).
Check engine oil level at the dipstick. Add SAE 10W30 oil if oil is below the full mark on the dipstick. *this should be done with seat (and under seat storage Tray if equipped) removed, with UTV on flat level surface
Check engine for correct RPM. Set to factory specification if needed.
Check tie rods for tightness.
Check Choke Control. It should move and return freely.
Step on foot brake to make sure the pedal is firm and does not go to the floor.
Make sure seats and seat belts are properly fastened to the frame.
Make sure all safety decals are in place.
Check headlights to make sure they are working and are properly mounted.
Inspect air cleaner element. Make certain it is clean and in place.
Inspect the fuel tank to make sure it is properly installed and that there are no leaks.
Check fuel level to make sure there is at least 1/8 of a tank of gas prior to performing initial starting operations.
Inspect fuel lines to make sure they are properly installed and that there are no leaks.
Check steering by executing a full lock to lock turn in each direction.
Check parking brake to make sure it will engage, hold and release.
Check throttle control to make sure it moves and returns freely.
Check differential oil level at the differential oil plug. Add 30 weight oil if oil is low.

Check overall appearance for cleanliness and for body and molding damage.
Dealer Test Ride List Check engine for starting, accelerating, running smooth, and idling smoothly.
Check steering response. There should be no free play.
Check forward, neutral, and reverse shifting response. Also check neutral start response.
Check parking brake to make sure it engages, holds, and disengages.
Make sure throttle is responsive and returns freely.
Make sure the suspension ride is satisfactorily and stable.
Make sure there are no fuel or petroleum leaks.
Make sure the foot brake has a firm engagement and that stopping is straight.
Make sure there are no abnormal rattles or vibrations.
Dealer Delivery to Customer List Warranty registration form is complete.
Owner's Manual has been delivered to and reviewed by the customer.
Engine Manual has been delivered to and reviewed by the customer.
Warranty Policy limits and requirements have been explained to the customer.
Location and functions of vehicle controls have been explained.

Section 3 Assembly Instructions

Pre-Assembly Instructions

- 1) Read Owner's Manual.
- Unpack all vehicle and assembly parts. Make sure you have everything listed on the previous page.

Seat / Brushguard Assembly

- Place seat back frame on vehicle frame tubes. Insert a 5/16" x 2" socket head bolt through both bottom joints. The head of the bolt should be on the outside of the vehicle. Put a curved washer on the threaded end of the bolt. Place a 5/16" nylock nut on the bolts but do not tighten.
- 2) Place the cage on front vehicle frame tubes and seat back. Insert a 5/16" x 2" socket head bolt through all four joints. The head of the bolt should be on the outside of the vehicle. Put a curved washer on the threaded end of the bolt. Place a 5/16" nylock nut on the bolts. Tighten all 6 nuts (including step 3).



Bumper Installation

 Align the holes in the front bumper with the mounting holes in the front frame tubes. Insert the four 5/16" x 2" bolts through the bumper bracket and then into the frame tubes. Put a curved washer on the threaded end of the bolt. Place a 5/16" nylock nut on the bolts and tighten.

Steering Wheel Installation

- Remove the plastic steering column cover by removing the 3 screws on the bottom with a 5/16" socket. If equipped with top and bottom steering column covers
- 2) Turn vehicle steering so that it is pointed straight forward. Line up holes in steering wheel with mounting holes so that the center spoke is pointing down. Install ¼" x 1 ¾" hex head bolts from the back. Tighten with ¼" nylock nuts.
- 3) Install steering cap with #8 black screw.
- Re-install steering column cover.

Cargo Bed Installation

1) Locate rear frame stubs at the rear of frame. The bed pivot tube on the stub should be at the top. Insert 5/16" x 2" socket head bolt. Loosely install 5/16" center lock nut (do not tighten until after cargo bed is installed)





- 2) Place the cargo bed on the vehicle and insert a 5/8" x 4" hex head bolt through each pivot bracket and frame stub tube.
- 3) Tighten both 5/16" frame stub bolts and nuts.
- 4) Install the 5/8" nylock nuts on the pivot bolts. Tighten the pivots and then loosen 1/4 turn.
- 5) Loosen the bed latch pin bolt on the frame just enough for it to slide in the adjustment slot. (shown in upper right photo)
- 6) Close the bed and position the latch pin bolt so that it is at the bottom of the latch slot to prevent rattles. Tighten the latch pin.





7) Fenders installation (if Equipped, no fenders on TW265) Tilt the cargo bed up. Line up the holes in the rear fenders with the square holes in the bed. The raised rectangular surface on the fender should be completely hidden under the bed. If not, turn the fender around. Insert a 1/4" x 3/4" carriage bolt through the bed and into the fender. Fasten with a 1/4" flat washer and a 1/4" nylock.



Seat Base Installation

 Place tabs attached to seat base under front seat frame bar (if equipped into slots in plastic tray), fold seat base into position. (if equipped The rear tabs should fall into the slots in the rear of the plastic tray)

Section 4 Operating Instructions

General Operation

Start your Utility Vehicle by following the starting procedures as noted below.

- Depress brake pedal with your foot and hold.
 Pull firmly up on the park brake lever with your hand until the lever is tight.
- 2. Place gearshift in neutral
- 3. Apply choke fully when engine is cold.
- 4. Turn ignition key fully clockwise and hold to stop engine.
- Release ignition key to run position and choke to normal operating position immediately after engine starts.
- Turn ignition key counterclockwise to stop engine.

Driving is as easy as driving a car with an automatic transmission. A simple forward and reverse shifter provides direction control.

Just turn the key and the 12 volt electric starter provides safe and easy starting. There is a manual choke control below the seat for quick cold weather starting. A back-up pull-rope starter mechanism is provided on the engine just in case you accidentally leave the key on and run the battery down. The infinitely variable torque converter drive system means there is no clutching. You just shift into either forward or reverse when the vehicle is stopped and press the throttle pedal to go. Never shift while the vehicle is moving.

Braking is accomplished by simply depressing the brake pedal that is located on the floorboard left of the accelerator. A lever action parking brake control is mounted on the center console located between the operator and passenger seats. Depress the button on the park brake control lever to release the park brake.

Pre-Start Check List

Check tire pressure as indicated.
Make sure wheel lug bolts/nuts are tightened to 65ft. lbs.
All nuts, bolts, screws, and fasteners should be checked.
Turn on headlights to make sure battery has a charge and electrical lighting circuit is working.
Check tail lights and brake lights. (if applicable)
Check park brake to make sure it will engage, hold and release.
Check steering by executing a full lock to lock turn in each direction.
Check engine oil level at the dipstick. Add oil as indicated.
Check differential oil level at the differential oil plug. Add gear lube as indicated.
Check fuel valve lever position. Valve lever should be off except when running the engine.
Check fuel level to make sure there is at least 1/8 of a tank of gas prior to performing initial starting operations.


Operation of Four Wheel Drive Features

The rear axle is equipped with a manually operated differential lock. It is engaged (locked) by moving the differential lever to the left and down. Locking the differential sends equal power to both rear wheels for better traction. It may be used in both 2WD and 4WD modes.

Note: Locking the differential on paved or hard surfaces may increase steering effort and tire wear.

To switch to four wheel drive, the front wheels are engaged simply by flipping the dashboard switch to 4WD. In 4WD mode power is automatically sent to the front wheels when the rear wheels lose traction.

Warning: Bring engine to an idle before selecting 4WD mode. Sudden engagement of 4X4 switch under power may damage drive train. Failure to do so may void warranty.



F-N-R Shift Lever Differential Lever "Push to Left" 4WD On/Off Switch Because the power transfer is automatic, you may operate the vehicle in 4WD mode continuously without affecting steering effort or tire wear.

Maintenance

Hydraulic Brakes – Hydraulic Brakes use fluid pressure to transfer the braking force to the wheels. Before driving the vehicle each day, check the fluid



level in the reservoir. The reservoir is located under the hood behind the front differential gear box. Fill to the MAX line with DOT 3 brake fluid.

If you notice that the brake pedal feels spongy or the vehicle is not stopping well, take the vehicle to a qualified service center.

Front Differential Gear Box – It is recommended that the oil be changed once every 2000 miles (about 150 to 200 hours). To change the oil, follow each step on the procedure listed below.



1Remove the oil drain plug located on the bottom of the gear case using a 7/16" socket.

- 3. Let all the oil drain out of the unit. Catch and discard the oil properly.
- 4. Be sure to clean off any debris on the drain plug and reinstall using a new nylon washer

- (part #20843). Torque the oil drain plug to 9 ft*lbs.
- Remove the oil fill plug using a 5/16" hex key wrench.
- 6. Add 150 ml. (5 oz.) of Mobil fluid 424
 American SportWorks part # 20848 (note: do
 not use any other type of oil in this system
 or the 4WD will not operate properly!)
- 7. Reassemble the oil fill plug into the gear case and torque to 10 ft*lbs.

Gear Spacing adjustment

- 1. Locate set screw on front gear box.
- 2. Turn clockwise until you feel resistance.
- 3. Turn back counter clockwise ¼ turn.



Rear Transaxle Gear Box – It is recommended that the oil be changed once a year or after 600 hours. See page 18 of owner's manual.

90° Transfer Gear Box – It is recommended that the oil be changed once a year or after 600 hours.

- Remove the oil drain plug located on the bottom of the gear case using a ¼" hex key wrench.
- 2. Let all the oil drain out of the unit. Catch and discard the oil properly.
- 3. Be sure to clean off any debris on the drain plug and reinstall. Torque oil drain plug to 10 ft*lbs.
- 4. Remove the oil fill plug using a ¼" hex key wrench.
- 5. Add 200 ml. (7 oz.) of 80W90 gear oil.
- 6. Reassemble the oil fill plug into the gearcase and torque to 10 ft*lbs.



Strut ball joint lube – It is recommended that the lower strut ball joint be lubricated every 3 months or after driving in water, mud or dusty conditions. The grease fitting is located on the back side of the strut. (see photo)

Read, understand and follow the safety label on the instrument panel. Be sure you understand how to operate the vehicle, its equipment and how to use it safely. Maintaining good performance depends to a large extent on the operator.



severe injury or death.

Plan carefully before using the vehicle to go significant distancés over questionable terrain. Remember that a one hour drive may take many hours to walk out should you run out of battery power or be stranded by becoming stuck on unsuitable terrain.



Do NOT let metal objects fall from the seat onto the top of your batteries. This may cause a serious power short and possibly a fire.



Hydrogen gas is generated as a natural part of the lead acid battery charging process. A 4% concentration of hydrogen gas is explosive and could cause severe injury or death. Charging must take place in an area that is adequately ventilated (minimum of 5 air exchanges per hour).

To reduce the chance of battery explosion that could result in severe injury or death, never smoke around or charge batteries in an area that has open flame or electrical equipment that could cause an electrical arc.

Hydrogen gas is generated in the charging cycle of batteries and is explosive in concentrations as low as 4%. Because hydrogen gas is lighter than air, it will collect in the ceiling of buildings necessitating proper ventilation. Five air exchanges per hour is considered the minimum requirement.

Never charge a vehicle in an area that is subject to flame or spark. Pay particular attention to natural gas or propane gas water heaters and furnaces.



Always wear a safety shield or approved safety goggles when adding water or charging batteries.

Any electrolyte spills should be neutralized with a solution of 1/4 cup (60 ml) sodium bicarbonate (baking soda) dissolved in 1 1/2 gallons (6 liters) of water and flushed with water.

Overfilling batteries may result in electrolyte being expelled from the battery during the charge cycle. Expelled electrolyte may cause damage to the vehicle and storage facility.

Aerosol containers of battery terminal protectant must be used with extreme care. Insulate metal container to prevent can from contacting battery terminals which could result in an explosion.

Battery Prolonged Storage

All batteries will self discharge over time. The rate of self discharge varies depending on the ambient temperature and the age and condition of the batteries.

A fully charged battery will not freeze in winter temperatures unless the temperature falls below - 75° F (-60° C).

For winter storage, the batteries must be clean, fully charged and disconnected from any source of electrical drain. Please assure that the key switch is in the off position for storage.

As with all electric vehicles, the batteries must be checked and recharged as required or at a minimum of 30 day intervals.

WASHING YOUR 48 VOLT ELECTRIC UTV

It is acceptable to wash your electric utility vehicle, though a pressure washer should not be used, and common sense should be exercised. Remember that some of the electronics in the controller and charging system are sensitive to water and corrosion. The charger should be protected during washing by placing a plastic bag or other protection over the top of the charger before washing. Allow for any water that does get on/in the charger to dry out before using.

!! Deep Water Crossings Must be Avoided !!

Charge Gauge



Before operating the 48V, make sure the batteries have a full charge!

Located on the dash, the charge gauge indicates approximately the state of charge of the batteries. Far right (as shown) indicates batteries are fully charged, far left indicates a low charge.

Battery Charging

- Your charger is equipped with a flooded / gel charge mode switch, set switch to **FLOODED** mode.
- Plug the AC cord into a **grounded** outlet. If an extension cord is used, a heavy duty cord of no more than 25 feet must be used. The extension cord must be AWG 12 or heavier.
- Turn charger on.
- A fully discharged battery set will take 9-12 hours to fully recharge.



BATTERY WATERING

Flooded batteries need water. More importantly, watering must be done at the right time and in the right amount or else the battery's performance and longevity suffers.

Water should always be added after fully charging the battery. Prior to charging, there should be enough water to cover the plates. If the battery has been discharged (partially or fully), the water level should also be above the plates. Keeping the water at the correct level after a full charge will prevent having to worry about the water level at a different state of charge.

Depending on the local climate, charging methods, application, etc. Trojan recommends that batteries be checked once a month until you get a feel for how thirsty your batteries are.

Important things to remember:

- 1. Do not let the plates get exposed to air. This will damage (corrode) the plates.
- 2. Do not fill the water level in the filling well to the cap. This most likely will cause the battery to overflow acid, consequently losing capacity and causing a corrosive mess.
- 3. Do not use water with a high mineral content. Use distilled or deionized water only.

CAUTION: The electrolyte is a solution of acid and water so skin contact should be avoided.

Step by step watering procedure:


- 1. Open the vent caps and look inside the fill wells.
- 2. Check electrolyte level; the minimum level is at the top of the plates.
- 3. If necessary add just enough water to cover the plates at this time.
- 4. Put batteries on a complete charge before adding any additional water (refer to the Charging section).
- 5. Once charging is completed, open the vent caps and look inside the fill wells.
- 6. Add water until the electrolyte level is 1/8" below the bottom of the fill well.
- 7. A piece of rubber can be used safely as a dipstick to help determine this level.
- 8. Clean, replace, and tighten all vent caps.

Mode Switch

Your 48V UTV is equipped with a mode switch. These two modes allow for parental control of the speed of the vehicle.

The switch is located on the left side of the vehicle, under the bed. The fast mode will allow speeds up to 18 mph. The slower mode will allow speeds up to 10 mph. "Slow Mode" also has a more gentle acceleration curve. The vehicle range is considerably greater in slow mode as well.





Add, Check and Drain Axle Lubricant

SAE 30W oil is used in the transaxle..

Oil should be changed after one year of normal use, and every other year after. To change the oil, a vacuum device may be used to remove the old fluid.

To fill, fresh oil should be added up to the level of the plug.


Fuses

Your 48V Vehicle has fused protection for the main motor circuit, along with the low amperage 48 volt circuit, and the 12 volt circuit. Pictured below is the 500 amp main fuse. This fuse will blow in the event of a short across the battery posts, or a catasatrophic failure in the motor or controller. Should this fuse blow, it must be replaced with a like 500 amp fuse. These fuses are available through your dealer. Main fuse is illustrated below.



In addition to the main fuse, there are three smaller fuses to protect the 12volt and 48 volt circuits. These fuses are illustrated below. Should these fuses blow and need replacement, a replacement fuse of the same rating must be used.



Located on the dash, the forward/reverse switch selects the direction of the vehicle. The operator must select the proper switch position before applying the throttle.








This vehicle is capable of reaching speeds in excess of 25mph. Use caution when turning to avoid vehicle rollover. Improper operation of this vehicle may cause serious injury or death. Maintaining safe performance depends to a large extent on the operator.

Read, understand and follow all warning decals as well as your entire owners manual before operating this vehicle.

CAUTION

This utility vehicle comes equipped with a Low Oil Indicator Light located on the dash panel in the center of the vehicle. This light will come on when the key is turned to the "on" position, and then go off after the engine is started. While operating the vehicle if the oil light becomes illuminated immediately turn the key to the "off" position to kill the engine.

This utility vehicle is not equipped with any underseat storage.

This vehicle comes standard with 25"x11" -12" off road tires. To compensate braking with the larger tires, the front hydraulic system is equipped with 8" rotors. The rear is the standard hydraulic drum setup.

Fuel Type

The fuel tank is located under seat.

TW11, TW 413, CW11, CW413 Fuel Capacity is 5 Gal.

CW-265 & TW265 Fuel capacity is 1.6 Gal.

When filling the fuel tank, place the gear shift in forward or reverse, set the park brake, turn off the engine, and remove ignition key. Clean dirt from around the fuel tank cap, remove cap, and begin filling. When finished, screw the cap back on securely and wipe up any spilled gasoline. Use regular unleaded gasoline with an octane rating of 87 or higher.

IMPORTANT: Never use methanol, gasoline containing methanol, or gasohol containing more than 10% ethanol because the fuel system could be damaged. Do NOT mix oil with gasoline.

Using a fuel stabilizer/conditioner in the vehicle can provide benefits such as:

- * Keeps gasoline fresh during storage of 90 days or less. For longer storage, drain the fuel tank.
- * Cleans the engine during operation.
- * Eliminates gum-like varnish build-up in the fuel system.

Add the correct amount of gas stabilizer/conditioner to the gas. Follow the gas stabilizer/conditioner manufacturer's directions for best results.

See engine operator's manual for the following:

- * Draining the fuel tank.
- * Checking fuel line for cracks and leaks.
- * Engine fuel valve lever.

Engine Maintenance

General Information

Detailed instructions and recommendations for break-in and regular maintenance are specified in the engine operator's manual. Engine warranty is backed by the engine manufacturer. Please refer to engine manufacturer's manual for engine servicing, lubricating oil levels, oil quality and viscosity recommendations, bolt torques, etc. Special attention should be paid to applicable data that is not duplicated here.


Engine Fuel Valve Lever

Refer to Figure 5-1

The engine fuel valve opens and closes the passage between the fuel tank and carburetor. Leave fuel valve lever in the OFF position when the engine is not in use to prevent carburetor flooding and reduce possibility of fuel leakage into the cylinder cavity and engine oil reservoir. Turn fuel valve lever to the ON position when running the engine.

* Foam element - Clean foam element with detergent in warm water or in a nonflammable solvent. Do not wring element. Squeeze excess cleaning fluids out. Allow time for the element to dry and then soak it with clean engine oil. Squeeze excess oil out. Excess oil left in the filter will cause engine to smoke briefly when first started.

Before installing the filter elements to make sure they have not been damaged during cleaning. Never run an engine without the filters installed.



Engine Oil

A general description for engine oil maintenance, recommendations, and capacities is provided below. See Engine Operator's Manual for a detailed description.

Note: Running engine low on oil can cause engine damage and void engine warranty.

Note: Overfilling of oil level can cause loss of power, engine damage and void engine warranty.

Engine Oil Fill and Drain Locations Refer to Figure 5-4

REMOVE SEAT (and plastic tray if equipped) FOR EASY ACCESS

- Filler cap/dipstick location: At front of engine
- Drain plug location: At rear end of engine
- Type of Lubrication: SAE 30
- API classification of SJ, SL or Equivalent
- Honda Oil Capacity: 1.16 US gts. /1.1 liters
- Subaru 265cc Oil Capacity: 1.1 US gts. / 1.0 liters
- Subaru 653cc Oil Capacity: 1.64 US qts./ 1.55 liter

Engine Oil Maintenance Schedule

- * Check oil level after each use.
- * Make first oil change after the first month of operation or at 20 hours of operation (whichever comes first).
- * Make all subsequent oil changes every 6 months or every 100 hours of operation (whichever comes first).

Engine Oil Level Check

Refer to Figure 5-4

Check engine oil daily with filler cap/dipstick located at the engine rear end as follows:

- 1. Park Vehicle on a level surface, set park brake, turn off ignition switch, and remove switch key.
- 2. Remove filler cap/dipstick and wipe it clean.
- Insert and remove dipstick without screwing it into the fill neck. Check oil level shown on dipstick.
- 4. Fill to edge of oil fill hole with recommended oil when oil levels are low.

5. Replace filler cap/dipstick and tighten securely. **Engine Oil Change**

Warms oil drains quickly and completely. Therefore, drain used engine oil while engine is still warm as follows:

- 1. Park vehicle on a level surface, set park brake, turn off ignition switch, and remove switch key.
- Place a suitable container below engine to catch used oil. Remove filler cap/dipstick and drain plug.
- 3. Allow used oil to drain completely and then reinstall and tighten drain plug securely.
- Dispose of used motor oil in a manner that is compatible with the environment. Do not throw used oil in the trash. Do not pour it on the ground, or down a drain.
- 5. Fill oil to the outer edge of the oil fill hole with recommended oil. Engine must be level when filling.
- 6. Replace filler cap/dipstick and tighten securely.



Transaxle Oil

A general description for transaxle oil maintenance, recommendations, and capacities is provided below.

NOTE: Running vehicle low on transaxle oil can damage transaxle and void warranty.

Transaxle Oil Type, Fill, and Drain Refer to Figure 5-5B

- * Fill cap location: At rear left hand side (See arrow)
- * Drain plug location: At bottom center of transaxle.
- * Type of Lubrication: SAE 30W oil.
- * Transaxle Lubrication Capacity: 20 oz.

Transaxle Oil Maintenance Schedule

- * Check transaxle housing for damage and possible oil leakage after each use.
- * Check transaxle oil level every 6 months or every 200 hours (whichever comes first).

This can be accomplished by Parking vehicle on a level surface, set park brake, turn off ignition switch, and remove switch key, using a clean long bladed screw driver (or similar object) insert into filler hole until it touches the bottom of gear case. Remove the screw driver. There should be approximately 2.1/4" to 2.1/2" of oil visible on screw driver. Refer to Figure 5-5A

* Change transaxle oil once a year or every 600 hours (whichever comes first).

Transaxle Oil Change

Warm oil drains quickly and completely. Therefore, drain used transaxle oil while transaxle housing is still warm as follows:

- 1. Park vehicle on a level surface, set park brake, turn off ignition switch, and remove switch key.
- Place a suitable container below the transfer case to catch used oil. Remove fill cap and drain plug.
- 3. Allow used oil to drain completely and then reinstall drain plug and tighten it securely.
- 4. Dispose of used transaxle case oil in a manner that is compatible with the environment. Do not throw used oil in the trash, pour it on the ground, or down a drain.
- 5. Fill transaxle housing with 20 oz. SAE 30W oil.
- 6. Replace fill cap and tighten securely.

Drive Belt

The dive belt is considered a wearable item. Replacement intervals depend on vehicle use and environment. If your belt is slipping you may need to replace it.

- 1. Park vehicle on a level surface, set park brake, place shifter in Neutral, turn off ignition switch, and remove switch key.
- 2. Remove the upper belt covers. (It is not necessary to remove the bottom cover.
- 3. "Walk" the belt off of the rear pulley as shown in Figure 5-6.

- 4. Install the new belt on the front pulley first and "walk" it onto the rear pulley.
- 5. Reinstall the belt guards. Figure 5-7.

Attention: Failure to reinstall the belt guards may void your warranty.

Fuel in the Cylinder Cavity

In the event that the fuel valve is left open while transporting or towing this Utility Vehicle it is possible that fuel has leaked down into the cylinder cavity. If this has occurred the engine will not start. With the cylinder cavity full of fuel the engine will feel like it has "locked up". Below are the proper steps to follow if your Utility Vehicle engine seems to have fuel in the cylinder cavity.



Use EXTREME CAUTION when performing the activity below. Gasoline is EXTREMELY FLAMABLE!

- 1. Move the vehicle to a well ventilated area, away from sparks or flame.
- 2. Park Vehicle on a level surface, set park brake, turn off ignition switch, and remove switch key.
- 3. Next, remove the wire connected to the spark plug. And remove the spark plug from the engine. (See Figure 6-1) (Spark Plug Wrench supplied with Operator's Manual)
- WARNING: Stand away from the spark plug hole when performing step 5. Fuel can spray several feet.
- 5. Wearing eye protection, slowly pull the recoil start grip handle (See Figure 6-2) in an upward motion. This should force the fuel out of the cylinder cavity through the spark plug hole. Caution: This gasoline spraying out of the cylinder cavity is very flammable, use extreme caution and make sure there are no sparks or flames nearby.
- 6. Repeat step 3 until only air escapes out of the spark plug hole.
- 7. Properly replace the spark plug back into the cylinder head, move the vehicle away from any spilled fuel. If there is fuel on the vehicle itself, allow for it to evaporate before continuing.
- 8. Connect the plug wire. Your Utility Vehicle is now ready to start.





Trouble Shooting

Steering feels funny/pulling to one side/hard to steer (Call normally for 4wd)

Probable Cause:

• One side may still be engaged in 4wd with the switch off.

Possible Remedy:

- Put unit in reverse and back up straight a few feet to get the axle to release.
- If this does not work take the unit to a service center.

Engine Shuts down when turning or on inclines or uneven terrain-

Probable Cause:

• Oil is low or Honda oil sensor is bad

Possible Remedy

- Check oil level with unit on level ground-Adding more oil or making sure the oil is completely full can help to not alert the low oil sensor.
- Honda Low oil alert sensor may be bad and must be replaced by authorized Honda service center.

Engine will not start but does turn over with electric starter.

Probable Cause

• Fuel valve may be off, spark plug may be fouled (excessive idling or running unit with choke engaged can cause plugs to foul), or engine oil may be low.

Possible Remedy

- Make sure fuel valve is on.
- Replace spark plug and try to restart.
- Check oil level with unit on level ground-Adding more oil or making sure the oil is completely full can help to not alert the low oil sensor.

Engine will not start and does not turn over with electric starter.

Probable Cause

• Shifter is not in neutral, battery may be low or bad, neutral switch on transmission may be unplugged or bad, key switch or its connections connectors may be unplugged or bad, electric starter may be bad.

Possible Solutions

- Shifter must be in neutral
- Turn key to on position and use recoil start
- If this works recharge or replace the battery
- Check neutral switch on transmission to make sure it is plugged in.
- Check all connections to key switch (switch may be unplugged behind fire wall).
- Key switch may be bad-switch must be changed out with new one
- Have authorized Honda Service Center check the electric starter

Gas in oil

Probable Cause

• Unit may have been transported with fuel valve on. Every time a unit is transported on a trailer or in a truck the fuel must be shut off using the shut off valve on the side of the engine. Leaving this valve open during transport could allow fuel to be deposited into the crank case locking the engine up.

Possible Solution

- Oil in engine must be drained completely and changed with fresh oil
- Run unit and check oil again –if no gas is found in oil-unit is ready.
- SEE PAGE 19 of this manual for instructions

Brakes don't work well / Hard to push / no travel in pedal

Probable Cause

The brake rotors are dirty.

Possible Solution

4x4 units

- Clean the rotors with brake cleaner and test.
- A stiff pedal is normal for our 4x4 unit-
- A stiff pedal means good pressure in the brake lines
- Check brake pads and front calipers

2wd units

• The 2wd units have an automatic brake adjuster. Put the unit in reverse, back up at low speed, and step hard on the brakes. This should give enough brake adjustment.

If you continue to have problems, discontinue use and take it directly to an authorized service center

Belt slipping/will not pull up hill

Probable Cause

- Too much weight (hauling/towing excessive weight can cause belt to slip).
- The belt is wet
- The torque converter pulleys are dirty.
- Belt may have stretched or have a low spot causing slipping-replace belt

Possible Solution

- Lighten the load.
- Clean the torque converter and dry the belt
- Replace the belt

American SportWorks Utility Vehicle Shifter Trouble Shooting

Notice: Always <u>check transmission oil</u> level. Dip a clean screwdriver straight down in the fill hole to the bottom of the gear case. There should be about 2 ½ inches of oil on the screw diver. If oil needs to be added, use SAE 30 motor oil. See Page 19 for Instructions

• Engine will not turn over when key is turned to start. – This vehicle is equipped with a safety switch that only allows starting in neutral.

Go to Neutral switch diagnostic procedure.

Gears grind when going into a gear or vehicle stays in gear when shifted to neutral. –
 Cables need to be lubricated or adjusted.

Go to Cable adjustment procedure.

Neutral switch diagnostic procedure

If starter does not engage when shift lever is in neutral:

- 1. Apply the parking brake.
- 2. Turn and hold the key to start. "Jiggle" the shift lever in the neutral slot. If the starter engages, release the key and call American SportWorks Customer service to order a neutral switch shim kit.
- 3. If the starter did not engage in step 2, turn and hold the key to start slowly move the shift lever from neutral to reverse if the starter engages, release the key. Repeat, moving the shift lever from neutral to forward.
 - If the starter did engage, go to Cable adjustment procedure section.
 - If the starter did not engage call Customer Service at 1-866-646-5278.

Cable adjustment procedure

Stiff or sticking cables can cause the vehicle to not shift properly and it may affect starting since the vehicle must go to neutral to start. Before attempting to adjust the cables there are several steps that can be taken to insure the cables are operating properly.

- Lubricate the cables. Behind the dash board there are two cables attached to the gear selector lever. Slide the rubber dust caps up the cable. Drip or spray penetrating oil into the cable housing while working the lever. Do this several times as the oil soaks into the housing. Test the vehicle. If this did not help move to the next step.
- Remove the center console (with cup holders). Find the shifter cables and cut the plastic
 ties that fasten them to the frame tube. Over tight cable ties can cause the cable to bind.
 Replace cable ties but leave them loose so that the cable can move in them. Test the
 vehicle. If it is still not performing correctly, move to the adjustment procedures that follow.



- 4. Pull the slack out of the forward most cable under the dash (but do not stretch the spring) and tighten the adjuster nuts.
- 5. Place the selector lever on the dashboard in reverse.
- 6. Make sure the transmission is fully engaged in reverse. The top of the shift lever on the transmission should be toward the passenger side. You may have to roll the rear wheels a little until it clicks in.
- 7. Pull the slack out of the rear most cable under the dash (but do not stretch the spring) and tighten the adjuster nuts.

If you have tried all of this and it is still not operating correctly, you may need new cables and a shifter update kit. Please call American SportWorks Customer Service at 1-866-646-5278. Have your Model and Serial number handy when you call.
















Terminal Block Wiring

Basic Operation:

The Hilliard Front Drive System (Differential) is an electro-mechanically-activated bi-directional overrunning clutch. When 12 volts of power is sent to the 4WD switch, the unit is activated to engage both front wheels instantaneously, whenever the rear wheels loose traction. The clutch also releases or overruns automatically the instant the rear wheels regain traction. Because torque is transmitted to both front wheels, it is a "true" 4WD. The over-running characteristics of this system allow for an on demand 4WD engagement and steering ease.

General Maintenance:

It is recommended that the oil be changed once every 2000 miles. To change the oil, follow each step on the procedure listed below.

Oil Change Procedure

- Remove the oil drain plug located on the bottom of the gearcase using a 5/16" hex key wrench.
- Let all the oil drain out of the unit. Catch and discard the oil properly.
- Be sure to clean off any debris on the drain plug and reinstall. Torque the oil drain plug to 10 ft*lbs.
- Remove the oil fill plug using a 5/16" hex key wrench.
- Add 150 ml. (5 oz.) of the Hilliard CFD Gearcase Lube (note: do not use any other type of oil in this system or the 4WD will not operate properly!)
- Reassemble the oil fill plug into the gearcase and torque to 10 ft*lbs.

Backlash Adjustment

- Using a 5/32" Allen wrench, turn the #10-24 socket head cap screw (located inside the hollowed out round boss
 protruding from the output cover) clockwise until it will not move any more (do not apply a lot of torque). At this
 point, you should not be able to turn the pinion gear (part #36). Do not tighten the screw.
- Now, slowly turn the backlash cap screw counter-clockwise while turning the pinion gear at the same time. Keep slowly turning the backlash cap screw until the pinion gear can rotate (4) times (1 revolution of the ring gear) freely without any tight spots. You should only have to turn the backlash cap screw between ¼ and ½ of a turn to have the proper backlash set.

Troubleshooting:

Problem: 4WD will not engage

- Check the minimum battery voltage going to the CFD Gearcase. The voltage should not read below 11 volts for the
 unit to operate properly. If the voltage is at or above 11 volts, continue on to step #2.
- 2. Check the resistance of the coil harness on the large output cover. This can be achieved by attaching a multi-meter to the (2) terminal pins (part #23 on the exploded view drawing located on page #5). The resistance should be 24.7 to 27.3 chors (at 20°C/68°F). If the unit does not read any resistance, then there is a short in the coil & wire harness. The large Output Cover Sub-Assembly (P/N 6203-12-100) needs to be replaced. If the resistance in the coil is satisfactory, continue on to step #3.
- 3. Check the armsture plate (part #19) for a consistent wear pattern. To do this, completely drain the oil from the unit by removing the drain plug (part #32) located on the bottom of the gearcase with a 5/16" bex key wrench. Collect the oil and dispose properly. Remove the (7) hex head bolts (part #2) from the large cover using a ½" socket. Set the unit on a flat surface with the large output cover (part #27) facing up. Carefully lift the large cover straight up off of the gearcase. Remove the clutch housing/ring gear (part #12) out of the gearcase (be sure to hold the roll cage with the clutch housing/ring gear to prevent the cage from falling out). Remove the retaining ring (part #8) out of the large cover and then remove the nylatron (plastic) shim (part #40). Pick up the armsture plate and wipe off any dirt or sludge. Inspect the surface that rides on the coil (part #26) located in the large output cover. There should be a consistent wear mark from the coil. Any interruptions in this wear pattern could indicate an out of flatness condition and the armsture plate will need to be replaced (part #11). You can also check the flatness by setting the armsture plate (tangs facing up) on a flat surface or granite block and making sure the plate does not rock. If the armsture plate wear is consistent and the plate is flat, continue on to step #4.
- 4. Check for the proper coil depth. The electro-magnetic coil (part #26) should set below the pole faces of the metal insert (steel u-shape piece pressed into the large cover assembly) located in the large output cover (part #27). To check this, simply run your fingers around the pole faces and make sure that the coil is correctly set below the metal insert along the entire circumference. If you feel the coil above the pole faces, replace the large output cover (P/N 6203-12-100). If the coil is fully below the pole faces, continue on to step #5.
- 5. Clean and inspect the internal clotch components. Slowly remove the roll cage (part #39) from the clutch housing/ring gear (part #12). Using a clean, dry, lint-free cloth, clean the (14) clutch rollers (part #38), the (2) race/output lucks (parts #16 & #17) and the internal profile in the clutch housing/ring gear (part #12). If there are any excessive scratches, nicks or deep flats present on any of these parts, replace with the proper service kit listed at the bottom of page 4:

Problem: 4WD will not disengage

1. Check the armsture plate (part # 19) for a consistent wear pattern and flatness. To do this, completely drain the oil from the unit by removing the drain plug (part #32) located on the bottom of the gearcase with a 5/16" bex key wrench. Coffect the oil and dispose properly. Remove the (7) hex head bolts (part #2) from the large cover using a ½" socket. Set the unit on a flat surface with the large output cover (part #27) facing up. Carefully lift the large cover straight up off of the gearcase. Remove the clutch housing/ring gear (part # 12) out of the gearcase (be sure to hold the roll cage with the clutch housing/ring gear to prevent the cage from falling out). Remove the retaining ring (part #8) out of the large cover and then remove the nylatron shim (part # 40). Pick up the armsture plate and wipe off any dirt or studge. Inspect the surface that rides on the coil located in the large output cover. There should be a consistent wear mark from the coil. Any interruptions in this wear pattern could indicate an out of flatness condition and the armsture plate will need to be replaced (part #19). You can also check the flatness by setting the armsture plate (tangs facing up) on a flat surface or granite block and making sure the plate does not rock. If the armsture plate wear is consistent and the plate is flat, continue on to sten #2.

- 2. Clean and inspect the internal clutch components. Slowly remove the roll cage (part #39) from the clutch housing/ring gear (part #12). Using a clean, dry, lint-free cloth, clean the (14) clutch rollers (part #38), the (2) race/output hubs (parts #16 & #17) and the internal profile in the clutch housing/ring gear (part #12). If there are any excessive scratches, nicks or deep flats present on any of these parts replace with the proper service kit listed at the bottom of this page.
- 3. With the roll cage out of the Clutch Housing/Ring Gear (#12) inspect the (14) H-Clip Springs (past #30) and make sure all the springs are intact and none are broken. If any of the springs are broken, replace the roll cage assembly with the proper service kit fisted at the bottom of this page.

Problem: Gear set is too loud

Refer to the "Backlash Adjustment" section located on the bottom of page 2.

Assembly Procedure:


To Reassemble the Gesrcase, follow the procedure listed below:


- Be sure that all parts are clean and free of any dirt or debris and all residual oil has been removed.
- Check the condition of the square sectioned o-ring located on the large output cover (part #7). Make sure that it is clean and free of any cuts or nicks. It is recommended that this part is replaced whenever the unit is taken apart.
- Place the thrust button (part # 41) back into the ½" hole located on the protruding boss on large cover plate (part #27). Place the thrust plate (part #13) on top of the same boss.
- Press the race/output hab with the 52" male dowel pin (part #17) back into the large cover (part #27).
- Set the annature plate (part #19) back onto the coil (part #26) located in the large cover plate (part #27). The tangs of the annature plate should face out from the cover.
- Place the nylatron (plastic) shim plate (part #40) on top of the annature plate and install the retaining ring (part #8) back into the slot located on the large cover (part #27).
- Insert the small needle roller bearing (part #6) onto the ½" dowel on the race/output hub.
- Reassemble the clutch housing/ring gear (Part #12), the roll cage (part #39) and the (14) rollers (part #38).
- 9. Insert the assembled clotch from step #8 onto the large cover plate being sure to line up and insert the tangs from the armsture plate (#19) into the mating slots on the roll cage (part #39). It is very important to make sure the tangs on the armsture plate are properly aligned into the slots on the roll cage or you will damage the armsture plate and the 4WD will not work!
- 10. Press the race/output hub with the 1/2" bushing (part #16) into the gearcase (part #28).
- Insert the genrease (part #28) back onto the large cover plate assembly. Be sure the boltholes are lined up and the pinion gear (part #36) and the chitch housing/ring gear (part #12) mesh property.
- Torque the (7) 5/16-18 UNC-2A x 1" long hex head bolts (part #2) to 17 ft*lbs.
- 13. Be sure to clean off any dirt or debris on the drain plug (part #32). Using a 5/16" hex key wrench, reassemble the plug into the bottom of the gearcase torque to 10 ft*fbs.
- Remove the oil fill plug (part #37) and fill the unit with 150 ml. (5 oz.) of the Hilliard 4WD CFD Georgese oil.
- 15. Reassemble the oil fill plug (part #37) into the genrease assembly (part #28) and torque to 10 ft*lbs.
- 16. Follow the "Backlash Adjustment" procedure located on the bottom of page 2 and set the backlash.



Turn Signal Controls MultiFunction Stalk -----Turn Signals/Horn/Headlights






Wiring of Tail Lights

After installation of the fenders, the tail lights must be wired. The wire harness is routed through the holes in the fender. Please note that these fender holes face inward after mounting.

As in the photos below, the **FLAG COLOR** on the harness wire is plugged into the corresponding **WIRE COLOR** on the taillight end. Note that these colors are not the same on the left as the right.
